Meet Aaron Rose Philip-Activitist Highlight in Honor of Pride Month



Aaron (A-ron) Rose Philip is an Antiguan-American model. In 2018, she became the first black, transgender, and physically disabled model to ever be represented by a major modeling agency and has since modeled in several major high fashion photo shoots and campaigns. In 2021, Philip debuted as an exclusive for Moschino's spring/summer 2022 fashion show, making her the first model using a wheelchair to walk for a major luxury fashion brand.

In 2016, at the age of 14, Aaron published a memior called This Kid Can Fly: It's About Ability (Not Disability), detailing her experiences growing up with cerebral palsy. She has actively worked towards an inclusive fashion industry. She has had editorial features in magazines such as Dazed, ELLE, Allure and Vogue. She was featured in The New York Times in 2018. She appeared in campaigns for Dove, Sephora, Outdoor Voices, and Nike.

The 34th Anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) is coming up in on July 26^h.. The ADA is a civil rights law that prohibits discrimination against individuals with disabilities in all areas of public life, including jobs, schools, transportation, and all public and private places that are open to the general public. The purpose of the law is to make sure that people with disabilities have the same rights and opportunities as everyone else.
